Mission Statement

Good Shepherd Catholic School prepares students for a life of learning, service, compassion, personal excellence, and faith in God.

Academic Program

Good Shepherd's full Preschool – 8th grade curriculum is available for your perusal in the main office.

Extra-Curricular Program

Good Shepherd offers a variety of extra-curricular programs which include an extended day program, an after-school program, soccer, basketball, and instrumental music lessons, drama, and a winter sports program.

Religious Life

The life of Good Shepherd Catholic School is in essence spiritual. Good Shepherd is dedicated to helping all members of the school community develop their relationships to God and may incorporate the following practices, in addition to daily religious education classes, in the day-to-day and season-to-season life of the school: prayer to open and close each day, a daily period of silence for prayer or reflection, grace before meals, weekly Mass with the faith community at the local church, regular visits to school and classrooms by our priests, devotion to Mary, the mother of Jesus, season-appropriate celebrations (for example, Thanksgiving, Advent, Lent, Holy Week), liturgical music, community service projects, presence of sacramentals (for example, crucifixes), teacher/staff retreats, and the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

All students are expected to actively participate in the religious life of the school including daily prayers and attendance at school Mass. Good Shepherd respects the religious traditions of all its students and does not seek to convert to Catholicism those students who are not Catholic. Therefore, Good Shepherd personnel will not proselytize or attempt to convert children of other faith traditions.

Philosophy

Good Shepherd Catholic School adheres to belief in Jesus Christ as the foundation of the entire educational enterprise in a Catholic school, and it recognizes its own role as part of the teaching mission of the Catholic Church. The school regards parents as the primary educators of their children and partners with the school.

Good Shepherd Catholic School recognizes the importance of the development of the whole child. We are committed to provide for the intellectual, spiritual, emotional, and physical growth

of each student in a creative and safe environment. We believe in academic excellence built on a sound framework of moral values; therefore, we use a traditional, value-centered approach to education.

Our instructional goal is to teach the art of learning and inquiry, with measurable results. Therefore, we follow a standards-based curriculum. With a contemporary understanding of child development and modern innovation, various educational methods are employed to insure individual mastery.

Good Shepherd Catholic School promotes quality work through respect for learning, discipline, honesty, and punctuality. We foster academic mastery, esteem through achievement, character development through a well-established moral compass, spiritual growth, and work ethic. It is our expectation that each student of Good Shepherd Catholic School will grow to his or her potential.

2022-2023 Tuition

The cost per pupil for the 2022-23 school year is over \$2,000 more per student than the tuition that we charge. The difference you pay for tuition for each of your children and this per pupil cost must be raised in the course of the fiscal year in order for the school to balance the budget. We ask you to prayerfully consider if you are able to pay the actual cost per pupil or indeed any amount above the tuition we charge.

Tuition for students registered in a Catholic parish is \$5,250 for the first child in a family, \$4,850 for the second who attends at the same time, and \$4,650 for each subsequent child who attends at the same time. Catholic parishes in Vermont offer financial support to Good Shepherd Catholic School (and to the other Vermont Catholic schools as well) for each student who is one of their parishioners.

Tuition for other-than-Catholic students is \$6,100 for the first child in a family, \$5,700 for the second who attends at the same time, and \$5,500 for each subsequent child who attends at the same time.

A non-refundable \$250 seat deposit is required after your child's acceptance to Good Shepherd. This amount will be applied toward the student activities expenses throughout the year. There are three payment options available: An early-payment discount of two percent will be extended to families who make full tuition payment by July 1, 2022; a two-payment plan with half being due by July 1, 2022 and half due by January 6, 2023; or a monthly payment plan using FACTS tuition management system.

Refund Policy

If a student transfers out of Good Shepherd before the end of a semester (half school year), it is expected that payment-in-full for that semester will be/will have been made. The \$250 seat deposit is non-refundable in this circumstance.

No tuition refund is given if a student is required to leave the school due to misconduct.

Application Information and Procedures

Catholic and non-Catholic children are invited to apply to Good Shepherd Catholic School; all students will be admitted on a space-available basis. Good Shepherd will not seek state approval as a special education provider. Nor do we have the resources or personnel to meet the needs of especially challenged children. Thus, Good Shepherd is not an appropriate placement for children with special education needs, extraordinary emotional needs, or who behave in ways which are disruptive to the learning environment of the school.

Application requirements include a completed application form, a \$50 non-refundable application fee, proof of the applicant's medical insurance, and a meeting at the school with the principal and/or teacher, and/or screening as the principal deems appropriate. All children entering kindergarten must be 5 years old by September 1st, 2022, and all applicants for kindergarten will be screened for readiness.

Uniforms

Good Shepherd students will take pride in how they dress, and it is our experience that uniforms make life simpler and less expensive for our families. It is understood that students will comply with uniform guidelines while in attendance at Good Shepherd. Uniform purchase information is available at Good Shepherd.

1. Upon signing this agreement, the parent/guardian of the applicant acknowledges and accepts responsibility for payment of tuition. No tuition refund is given if a student is required to leave the school for misconduct.
2. Good Shepherd Catholic School asks parents of new students to:
 - a. Submit a \$50 non-refundable application fee payable to Good Shepherd Catholic School.
 - b. Submit proof of child's medical insurance.
 - c. Schedule a meeting at the school with the principal and/or teacher, and/or schedule screening as appropriate. The applicant is encouraged to spend a day in the classroom at Good Shepherd.
 - d. Submit a copy of child's birth certificate.
 - e. Submit a copy of child's baptismal certificate.
 - f. Submit a copy of child's immunization record
3. A non-refundable \$250 deposit is required at the time of acceptance. This amount will be deducted from the student's activities expenses incurred throughout the year.
4. If the agreement is accepted and the student enrolled, he/she will adhere to *Good Shepherd Catholic School's Code of Conduct* and abide by all regulations of Good Shepherd Catholic School as stated in the *Parent/Student Handbook*.
